As Clark County's top prosecutor, District Attorney David Roger leads the largest and busiest law firm in the state. David manages a \$65 million budget and more than 700 attorneys and support personnel who handle approximately 65,000 cases annually. David is a longtime Las Vegan who graduated from Bishop Gorman High School in 1979. He went on to the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, where he majored in accounting and graduated in 1983 with a

### District Attorney David Roger

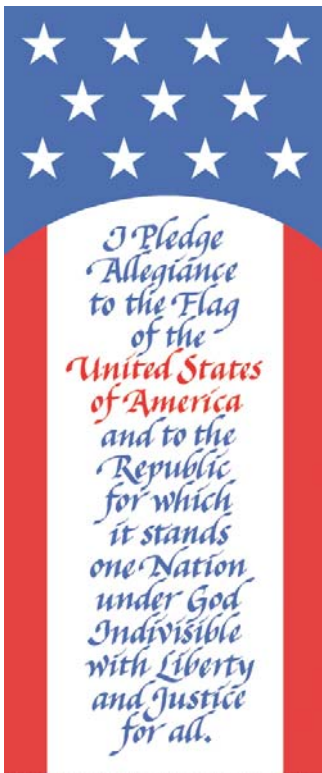
Bachelor of Science degree in business administration, and then went to law school.

After graduating from California Western School of Law in San Diego in 1986, David returned to Las Vegas, passed the Nevada Bar Exam and went to work as a law clerk for then-Clark County District Court judges Stephen L. Huffaker and Paul Goldman.

In 1987, David was recruited by the District Attorney's Office and became a deputy district attorney. He was soon assigned to the Major Violators Unit, where David prosecuted career criminals and murderers, and rose to chief deputy district attorney. David was first elected Clark County District Attorney in 2002, and was re-elected four years later.

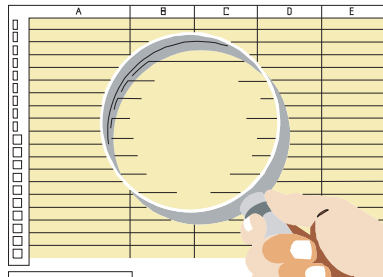
David has also received significant recognition from his peers in the legal community. In the Martindale - Hubbell legal guide David has the "AV" rating, which is the highest rating for professional and ethical standards. He was also named one of the Outstanding Young Men of America in 1987.

In addition, David is a member of the Nevada Bar Association, the Clark County Bar Association and the Nevada Prosecutors Advisory Council. He is the current director of the National District Attorneys Association, is a member and past president of the Nevada District Attorneys Association, and is a fellow at the American College of Trial Lawyers.

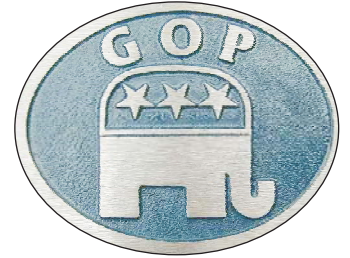

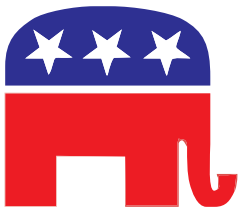

## Enforcing United States Immigration Law??

The current lack of employment opportunities in the country causes me to revive prior comments that would apply today even though these were previously presented.

Concerned lawmakers are attempting to attach HR 6633, the E-Verify program to any possible auto bailout bill. The E-Verify program has been effectively utilized by employers in their hiring process. E-Verify is an electronic tool that assures employers are hiring legal workers. This is a simple process of matching identification documents against databases handled by the Social Security Administration and the Homeland Security Department. The US House of Representatives passed the E-Verify authorization bill (H R 6633) by a vote of 407 to 2. The House of Representatives clearly demonstrated that it is the segment of the US Congress that represents the true sentiment of our populace. In contrast the U S Senate who had the bill at their doorstep for over four months is experiencing difficulty supporting the will of the American people.

It would appear that the human resources division and the employment offices of any business would welcome this process as a helpful and efficient tool in their employment activity. In this electronic age the cost to employers would be minimal requiring no additional equipment. Our current economic condition dictates that all aspects of safeguarding employment for Americans must be considered a high priority.

As events unfold and our current economic downturn seems constant we are afforded an opportunity to accelerate the continuous safeguarding of our efforts to restore the enforcement of our immigration laws. For example, simply pursuing some of the items outlined in a proposed Nevada Taxpayer and Citizenship Protection Act of 2009 would be a start.
